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Dan Kellerman has extensive experience with resilient infrastructure, having served as HNTB's manager and main point of contact for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers-New Orleans post-Katrina program. Kellerman led the effort for HNTB, which included more than \$70 million of planning, design and construction management on numerous large civil works, water resource, flood protection and environmental projects.

Under the contract, Kellerman served as program manager for USACE-New Orleans Gulf Intracoastal Waterway West Closure Complex; project manager for Orleans Parish Levee Inspections and Assessment; and part of the senior management advisory team for the City of Dallas Floodway System, Trinity River Levees project in Dallas.
